Methodology

Data on government spending on healthcare as a % of GDP was taken as the most recent year available from the World Bank World Development Indicators database. This was turned into spending as a proportion of government revenue using data from the IMF World Economic Outlook on GDP and government revenue.

Government external debt service as a proportion of government revenue is from a recent IMF and World Bank Debt Sustainability Analysis. Where these are not available it is calculated from the World Bank International Debt Statistics database, the IMF World Economic Outlook and the IMF's website.
